


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
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

Scaling-Up Inclusive Climate Resilience of Vulnerable Communities through **Locally Led Adaptation** (ICRA)



About ICRA Project

Considering the frequent impacts of climate change induced shocks and stresses on the lives and livelihoods of vulnerable communities living in disaster-prone regions, Islamic Relief Bangladesh has started IR USA funded ICRA project in Khulna. Satkhira, Jashore and Sylhet district which are vulnerable to tropical salinity, cyclones, storm surges, flooding, riverbank erosion, irregular precipitation, waterlogging etc. ICRA aims to enhance the resilience of vulnerable communities through Locally led Adaptation.



Objective

To enhance resilience of 18900 climate vulnerable people to combat against climate induced risks and hazards through Locally Led Adaptation.

Outcomes



Strengthened Disaster Resilience of 3700 climate vulerable families.



Strengthened capacity of 72 local disaster management institutions and enhance climate adaptation mechanisms.



National level policy makers and organisations are aware of, will support and co-finance scale-up of locally led adaptation (LLA).

Working areas



Major Activities



Locally Led Adaptation (LLA)

- Recognising LLA Plan of project areas and include them in National Adaptation Plan (NAP).
- Ensuring local co-financing in community infrastructure initiatives prioritised in LLA.
- Training to 400 local youths on LLA to monitor DRR & LLA activities.
- Establishing National level information platform on LLA in partnership with Department of Environment (Doe).
- Strenghtening of National level LLA working group.
- Capacity development to implement nature based solutions.



Disaster Management Committee (DMC)

- Activation & Reformation of DMCs with inclusion of Women, Youth, Person with Disabilities & Members of Community based Organisations.
- Empowerment of local actors to support LLA action.
- Develop capacity to access long-term funding for implementing LLA interventions.
- Enhance local capacities to assess climate risks and design adaptation responses.
- Enhancing collaborative action and investment.



Self Help Group (SHG)

- Establishing inclusive 148 SHGs to enhance economic & social empowerment by awareness raising & capacity building.
- Economic resilience of 3700 families through Income Generating Activities (IGA).
- Raising Locally operated Emergency fund, Adaptation fund & Mitigation fund.
